

Our community hospitals are our number one priority followed by partner 161,588 Our community hospitals are our number one priority followed by partner blood centers nationwide. With the help of our community minded blood donors, LifeServe impacted lives nationwide.

COVID-19 LONG-TERM IMPACT

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to affect blood donations nationwide. The largest impact has been to business, high school, and college blood drives which have decreased drastically. Due to the decline in blood drives, blood donations and first time blood donors, LifeServe has shifted our blood collection efforts to find blood donors where they are.

Prior to the pandemic, we collected 68% of our blood products in a mobile environment and 32% in our donor centers. In 2021, this took a drastic shift to collecting nearly half of our blood products in a donor center and half at mobile blood drives.

HOW MUCH DOES **UR DONATION HELP?**

A single hospital patient can require a large amount of blood in a single situation.



Cancer patients: Up to eight platelet units per week



Burn victims: Up to 20 plasma units



Automobile accidents: Up to 50 red blood cell units



• Heart surgery: Up to six red blood cell units + six platelet units



Organ transplants: Up to 25 plasma units + 30 platelet units + 40 red blood cell units



Premature infants: Up to five units
